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I. Introduction.

- A. A practical outworking of our salvation is that we walk in love.
- B. One must be purified.
- C. One must be born again.
- II. Condition of love: purity.
 - A. Dirty hearts cannot love. (Matthew 24:12)
 - B. No one is too dirty to be saved. (I Corinthians 6:9-11)
 - C. The purification of the soul ends up in the love of other Christians. (John 13)

III. Command of love.

- A. Love is commanded because *agape* love is not natural—it is a choice, not an emotion like *phileo* love. (II Peter 1:5)
- B. People fail miserably with agape love.
- C. Love should be reciprocal.
- IV. Cause of love: spiritual rebirth.
 - A. Believers love one another because they belong in the same family.
 - B. The believer is born again by the Word of God. (Romans 7:16-18, 21, 25, II Peter 1:4, I John 1)
 - C. The Word of God lasts forever.

V. Conclusion.

- A. We must not forget that the main command is to love one another.
- B. We must be converted to love.
- C. There must be a constant purification of the soul in order to accomplish this.
- D. It is important that we be constantly in the Word of God for this.
