Christian Armor, Part 1 John MacArthur

- I. Introduction.
 - A. Text: Ephesians 6:11-17.
 - B. There is spiritual conflict with the demonic for the Christian.
 - C. The Christian's responsibility is to join in the victory that Christ has provided.
 - D. The believer's responsibility is to put on the armor of God in a minefield loaded by Satan. We desperately need to be equipped because we are insufficient without God.
- II. Paul sees the Christian as a soldier and translates the armor of the soldier into Christian terminology.
 - A. God provides the armor--the believer cannot create his own armor.
 - B. He is to take the armor.
 - C. We are to stand against anything Satan throws. (James 4:9, I Peter 5:9, I Corinthians 9:24)
 - 1. We are to examine our lives so that we do not lose the crowns we have gained in the Christian life. (II John 8, II Peter 3:17)
 - 2. A person's ministry is just as important when it ends as when it began.
- III. Loins girded with truth.
 - A. If Satan is a liar, the Christian must be prepared to meet the lies with truth.
 - B. One is to meet Satan with truthfulness--that is, integrity.
 - C. You know how committed to truth you are by how obedient you are to it.
- IV. The breastplate of righteousness.
 - A. The breastplate protected vital organs.
 - B. The Christian who is righteous offers Satan no opportunity for success.
 - C. The Christian has no righteousness of his own. (Isaiah 64; Romans 3:23; 5)

- D. God gives the believer positional righteousness in Christ. It is a gift that is given--the believer cannot put it on. Consequently, the breastplate of righteousness must be referring to personal righteousness instead.
- E. Along with positional righteousness, there must be practical righteousness. (Romans 6:13, 19)
- F. If Satan can find a hole in the breastplate, Satan will drive his dagger in. (II Corinthians 2:9, I Corinthians 15:34, II Timothy 2:22)
- V. Shod with the gospel of peace.
 - A. Shoes were very practical for endless marches.
 - B. The gospel established a person's position. Our position depends upon the gospel. (Ephesians 2:14)
 - C. A believer must know his position so that Satan cannot tempt him. (I John 5:18)
 - D. Our shoes also enable us to carry the gospel. (Romans 10:15)
