I. Introduction.

- A. Tips for Bible study.
 - 1. Schedule a quiet time every day, not necessarily a Bible Study.
 - 2. It is better to study the Bible once a week for an extended period than sporadically.
 - 3. Avoid the television.
 - 4. Have a Bible study when you are awake and at your best.
 - 5. Keep a notebook.
 - 6. Get the right Bible Study tools such as Vine's Expository Dictionary.
 - 7. Spend a short time in prayer before Bible study. (Psalm 119:18)

 - 1. Read a chapter five times.
 - 2. Read it through without notes to avoid distraction.
 - 3. Read it through in different languages.
 - 4. Read it aloud.
 - C. Give a chapter title to summarize what is in the chapter. The shorter the title, the better it is.
 - D. Describe the contents of the chapter through a summary, outline, paraphrase, description or a list.
 - D. List the chief people in the passage.
 - E. Look for the most important verse.
 - F. Identify the chief words used.
 - G. Cross-reference other verses.
 - H. List what the chapter teaches us about Christ.

- J. In conclusion, write down a project to apply to the life.
