- A. Text: 1 Timothy 6:17-21.
- B. We have all had the opportunity to handle something that is valuable.
- C. It is basic to the Christian life that Christians lives out their Christianity on the basis of how they handle their stewardship.
- D. The highest form of worship is duty. (Romans 12, Matthew 4:12)
- E. Handling treasure is a duty.
- F. False teachers are motivated by the desire for money.
- II. The church has people who are wealthy by the design of God. (Deuteronomy 18, 1 Chronicles 29, 1 Samuel 2:7)
- III. To be rich is to have more than one needs.
 - A. We are the rich. (Acts 16)
 - B. The issue is not whether one is rich—the issue is how one deals with it.
- IV. Dangers to avoid in having riches.
 - A. Be not high minded.
 - 1. People tend to look down on people who are lower on the economic ladder.
 - 2. Riches and pride are twins. (Psalm 73:12)
 - 3. We are to be lowly minded. (Philippians 2:3)
 - 4. When one has a lot, he tends to trust in his riches instead of God. (Luke 12)
 - 5. We are to put our trust in God instead of money. (James 1:17, Psalm 50:10-12)
 - 6. God gives us things for enjoyment. (Ecclesiastes 5:18, Matthew 6:19-21)
 - B. Do not refuse good with it.
 - 1. Use your wealth to do noble things. (1 Timothy 5:8, 17; Acts 4; Titus 3:8)
 - 2. Give because Christ gave. (2 Corinthians 8:5)
 - 3. We use our money to share with God's people and advance of the kingdom.
 - 4. Consider the end result—lay hold of real life, which is eternal life. (1 Timothy 5, Luke 16:9)
