Free from Judgment, Part 1 John MacArthur

I. Introduction.

- A. Text: Romans 8.
- B. We are in misery because we are all born with the terrible condition of sin. (Ephesians 2)
- C. We are in misery because Satan also dominates us. (I John 3, Ephesians 2)
- D. We are in bondage to the trouble of creation—we face disease and death. (Romans 8:20, Job 5:7)
- E. We are heirs of God's judgment. (Hebrews 10:27)
- F. The sinner has only eternal damnation for which to look forward. (Revelation 20:14)
- G. It is remarkable therefore that there is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. (Romans 8:1-2)
- II. The reality that there is no condemnation. (Romans 5:12, 16, 18; II Thessalonians 1)
 - A. Man is under condemnation and the law of God cannot change it. (Romans 7:12)
 - B. The law could only intensify the sin within.
 - C. Even the coming of Jesus alone could not change that condemnation. (John 3:19, 17)
 - D. The death of Christ results in no condemnation. (Romans 5-6, Matthew 18)
 - E. The believer is free from any sin debt he incurred to God. (Hebrews 10:14, Colossians 1:12)
 - F. Jesus is the covering for our sin. (I John 1:9, 2:1-2, Romans 8:41)
- III. The reason there is no condemnation is that there is justification. (Romans 1; 3. 5:1, 8, 15; 6:14; 7:6)
 - A. As a result of the sacrifice of Christ, believers are no longer condemned.
 - B. Paul emphasizes that the Christian is not exempt from sin in Romans 7 but also that every believer is secure in Romans 8.
 - C. When the believer came to Christ, he was placed in Christ. (Romans 6:3)
 - 1. We are in Christ with a spiritual solidarity. (I Corinthians 15)
 - 2. We are in Christ vitally. (I Corinthians 12:13)
 - 3. We are in Christ relationally.

- D. Jesus prayed that believers would all be one in Him. (John 17)
- E. We can experience no condemnation because the law of the Spirit has made us free from the law of sin and death. (Romans 7:21)
- F. The Spirit is the one who gives life and energizes the believer.
- G. The law of the Spirit has freed the believer from the guilt of sin.
