Life in the Spirit, Part 3 John MacArthur

I. Introduction.

- A. Text: Romans 8:14-16.
- B. Romans 8 speaks to the topic of believer's adoption by God.

II. Adoption.

- A. This is a legal action whereby a person is taken into a family not biologically related to that family.
- B. God chooses those outside of perfection. (Exodus 2, Ester 2, 2 Samuel 9)
- C. God takes those as sons who were formerly enemies. (2 Corinthians 6:17-18, Romans 9:4, Ephesians 1:5)
- III. We who are saved have received the Spirit of adoption.
 - A. Believers have a no-condemnation status.
 - B. The Spirit transfers us into God's family and confirms in our hearts that we are related to God.
 - C. An adopted son in the Roman system is one who is chosen to bear the estate not merely one who is scooped up out of need. The same is true for a believer.
 - 1. The adopted one's ties were cut with the old family.
 - 2. The adopted person shared the same rights as children.
 - 3. The adopted person's debts were completely wiped out.
 - 4. The adopted person literally and absolutely the son of the new father under the law.
 - D. Regeneration happens also alongside adoption.
- IV. The Spirit confirms our adoption.
 - A. We are led by the Spirit.
 - 1. If we are killing the deeds of the flesh, it is evidence we are being led by the Spirit of God.
 - 2. The Spirit leads by bending and changing our will.
 - 3. We are dependent upon God's leading. (Proverbs 3:5-6; Psalm 25:4; 143:10; Isaiah 30:1; 48:16-17; Jeremiah 10:23)

- 4. The Spirit leads by illumination through the Bible. (Ephesians 1:15; 3; Colossians 1:8; 3:16; 1 Corinthians 2:14)
- 5. The Spirit leads through sanctification. (Psalm 119:35, 33; Galatians 5:16, 25)
- B. We are freed by the Spirit.
 - 1. There is no fear in love. (Hebrews 2:15; Romans 4:15)
 - 2. The Spirit of God produces confidence in us.
- C. We are told by the Spirit. The Spirit comes alongside our spirit and tells us that we are children of God. (Isaiah 7)
- V. We can enjoy the security of the Spirit by depending upon him for fruit and living out the truth. (2 Peter 1, 1 John 3:18)
