## Life in the Spirit, Part 4 John MacArthur

I. Introduction.

A. Text: Romans 8:17-30.

B. Our hope is that we will be like Jesus. (I John 3:2)

C. The hope of glory is the theme of this section of Romans 8.

D. There is security in our salvation--the believer is under no condemnation before God. (Romans 8:1)

E. The work of Jesus brought about this status, and the Holy Spirit continues to confirm it.

G. The Spirit guarantees our glory through the fact and feeling.

II. One cannot invent a salvation that does not end in glorification. The inherent truth of salvation is that it is a future reality.

A. There is a longing in man to gain back the glory that was with him before the fall.

B. In Christ the glory of God is restored in a man.

C. There is no salvation short of perfection.

D. We are already on the way. (II Corinthians 3:18)

III. The incomparable gains of glory. (Romans 8:17-18)

A. Since we are the children of God, we are also heirs. (Galatians 3:26, Hebrews 1:14, James 2:5, Colossians 1:12, Philippians 1:6)

B. There is a confidence that the believer has been saved unto glory.

C. God has given the believer the authority to be His son. (John 1:12)

D. We are heirs. God is the source of our inheritance. The best thing we could possess is God himself. (Galatians 3:29, 4:7, Colossians 3:24, Matthew 25:34, Psalm 73:25, Lamentations 3:24, Revelation 21:3)

E. We will receive an inheritance to the extent that Christ did. (Ephesians 1, Hebrews 1:2, Matthew 25:21, Hebrews 12:2, Revelation 20:4, 3:24, 3:12, 4:4, I Corinthians 15:49, I John 3:2, Luke 22:30)

G. We enter into the same glory as Christ. (John 17:22-24, Titus 3:7, Hebrews 9:15, Philippians 3:20, I John 3, I Peter 1:4)

H. Everything that happens in this earth ought to be in perspective to what a believer will receive. (Romans 5:2)

I. The proof of receiving this gift is suffering. Suffering results in greater growth. The more we suffer in this life, the more we will have a capacity for God in the next one. (II Timothy 2:11, I Peter 5:10, II Corinthians 4:8, I Peter 1:6, II Corinthians 1:5, Philippians 3:10, Colossians 1:24, Daniel 12:3, I Peter 5:1, I Thessalonians 5:23-24)
