 - D. Belief is essential. (John 8:30)
 - E. The mark of true faith is the confession of the Lordship of Jesus. (James 2:19, Hebrews 5-6, Romans 9:20-21, Acts 24, Matthew 19, Luke 9, Matthew 3, 17:5, Romans 14:9, I Corinthians 12:3, Ephesians 1, Philippians 1, Romans 10:13, Joel 2:32, Philippians 2:9-11, Romans 1)
