I. Introduction.

- A. Text: Luke 14:25-35.
- B. Salvation is easy and free, but discipleship will cost you everything. (Luke 9:62)
- II. We are to put Christ before family.
 - A. If we do not love ourselves, then how could we love our neighbors?
 - B. The man who looks after his health puts his family before Christ.
 - C. Yet we are to put Christ above family and self.
 - 1. The love we have for Christ should be so great that any other love could be called hate.
 - 2. Jesus loved his own mother by preparing someone to take care of her. (John 19:25-27)
 - 3. You love God by keeping His commandments—by doing what He says. (John 14:21)
 - 4. We are to love our families. (Isaiah)
 - 5. Jesus loved His mother, but compared to His love for God it was no contest.
- III. We are to daily take up our cross. (Luke 9:23)
 - A. Our cross is an implement of metaphorical death.
 - B. We need to build into our lives going the extra mile spiritually, mentally and physically.
 - C. Having one's own way is a primary thing that needs to die.
 - D. We are to take joy from physical or emotional suffering.
 - E. Whatever you do, do it heartily unto the Lord.
 - F. We ought to forgive those who infringe on our rights. (Isaiah 53:3)
 - G. The yoke of Jesus is light and easy. (Matthew 11:28-30)
 - H. The disciples never quibbled about dying literally. (John 21:18-19)
 - I. We are to put others before ourselves.
 - J. Missionaries have to bear the cross of becoming identified with the people. (Matthew 6:33)

- K. The more you love Christ, the more you love your family. (Luke 14:26)
- L. Self knowledge does not flatter. The more you know yourself, the more you can be closer to Him.

 - 1. Your family is your goal.
 - 2. Your wife is your partner.
 - 3. There is no division between the ministry to others and the family.
 - 4. Whatsoever you do, do it to the glory of God. (Colossians 3:23)
