 - 3. We have been sanctified in Christ Jesus. God cleanses us from our sins and clothes us in Christ's righteousness.
 - B. The Corinthians were not what they were in God's sight as they were in the sight of men because of their works of the flesh—they were immature.
 - C. The biggest problem in the church today is being saved and stuck.
 - D. What comes when churches are immature.

 - A. They were "the holy brethren," but they were dull of hearing.
 - B. They were babes in Christ.
 - C. One of the marks of the mature Christian is the ability to discern between good and evil.
 - D. They were dull of doing because they were dull of hearing—they were no good to God.
 - E. The reason they were dull in these areas because they were not in the Word of God.
 - F. You can be immature because of what you do or because of what you do not do.
 - G. If we do not lead a person on after bringing them to Christ, we only create problems.

 - A. We must leave the ABCs of Christ and go on to perfection.
 - B. Perfection means maturity.
