## Acts - Part 2 LeRoy Eims

- I. Introduction.
- II. The Apostles began to preach Christ and many came to believe on Him but not cleave to Him. Being Christian means we belong to Jesus.
- III. The message that the Apostles preached was that Christ had been raised. They preached the gospel and taught new converts. (1 Corinthians 15:3-4)
- IV. Paul returned to cities he visited risking his life not for preaching, but for follow up.
  - 1. The believers were exhorted to continue and confirm their right decisions. (1 John 5:11-12, 1 Corinthians 10:13)
  - 2. To retain is often more difficult than to acquire.
  - 3. The goal was not to see how much knowledge converts had but how much they learned. (Proverbs 27:23)
  - 4. Barnabus wanted to take Mark who had failed the mission before, but Paul disagreed. This caused their split ultimately. (Proverbs 22:19)
  - 5. Paul took one evangelistic campaign and the rest of his work was mostly follow up. (Acts 18:23)
- V. Your basic job is to feed the new convert in Christ.
  - 1. Follow up is not an easy job it took Paul three years at one point.
  - 2. How to do follow up.
    - 1. The converts must learn how to hold the Word of God themselves because everybody had to be involved and Christ had to receive the credit. (Philippians 2:16)
    - 2. The converts must learn to abide in Christ having intimate two way communication with Him in prayer. (1 John 2:28, John 15)
    - 3. Set an example in what you teach because God never uses a lie to accomplish His work. (1 John 2:12, 1 Thessalonians 2:18, Philippians 4:9)
    - 4. Focus on multiplication. (2 Timothy 2:2, Deuteronomy 1:11)
