VI. How to Recruit

1. Straight Forward...After some cultivation often very little. "I have been praying about doing a bible study with some men (couples) and as I have prayed you keep coming to mind."

2. Your Attitude- One beggar trying to help another beggar find bread

3. Ask for a specific commitment...

4. Limited Time (4 to 6 weeks)

5. Identifiable Study Material - Simple, beginner stuff, but challenging (You can increase the depth, but it is hard to simplify a study that is too tough for the beginner's spiritual maturity.)

6. Don't assume spiritual maturity by age or how long they have been in church! Deacon with diaper example. For the spiritual beginner... assure them they won't be put on the spot, or called on to pray. "We are all going to be learning together..."
