
Helping a New Christian Grow

3. Introduce the "Life Cycle of a Fruitful Christian" (illus)



 Involvement with people tends to take three forms: one-to-one visit/appointment/conversation small group (4 to 8 individuals) discussion oriented meeting large group meeting characterized by a single spokesman and listeners

5. Being a Role Model: Ask various ones to read these passages. Ask: Why do you think we are hesitant to offer ourselves as "role models" for younger believers?

The physical world often reflects principles of the Spiritual World. We have all grown and developed physically thanks to the care and concern of our parents. As a **Baby** – protection, love, basic knowledge As a **child** – consistent, strong guidance As an **adolescent** – strength, experience, responsibility As an **adult** – leadership ability, consistent self-discipline

6. If I only had three meetings with an individual this would be my plan:

First meeting: Assurance of salvation and explaining the need to grow by:

- a. sharing the Beginning with Christ booklet
- b. Looking at I John 5:11-13 and asking:
 - Where is eternal life found?

Who has eternal life?

How does one know if he has eternal life?

If you were to die tonight where would you spend eternity?

c. Memorizing with them I John 5:11-12

Second meeting: Explain how to grow by:

- a. Sharing the Wheel Illustration
- b. Reviewing I John 5:11-12.
- c. Begin to memorize John 16:24

Third meeting: Show him how to start growing by:

- a. Sharing the how and why of having a daily Quiet Time
- b. Continuing with memory verses from beginning with Christ booklet
- c. Encouraging them to attend church and to share their testimony

Factors affecting follow-up: relationship - genuine and authentic Ask: What are some fundamental principles and skills necessary for developing open, trusting relationships? commitment - problems of priorities in both our lives concentration - problem of attempting to work with too many people at same time duration - how long do we meet together experience - training level of the one doing the discipling environment - church and circle of associates that the new believer is in


