
E. BUT WHAT ABOUT MARRIAGE?

- 1. Marriage is part of life, but not all of life
 - i. Most of life you will not be married

- a) No marriage in heaven, Matthew 22:30
- ii. Marriage serves specific purposes
 - a) Man and woman reveal God more fully than either alone, Genesis 1:27
 - b) For multiplication, God's method for filling the earth, Genesis 1-2
 - c) Helpmate for the man, Genesis 2:18
 - d) Illustrate the relationship between Jesus and His church, Ephesians 5:22-33, Revelation 19:7-8
- iii. Marriage has responsibilities & costs, 1st Corinthians 7
- 2. The only promise is not in children, Isaiah 56:3-5
- 3. God nows your frame, Psalm 103:14
- 4. Lifelong singleness is given to few, Matthew 19:11-12
- F. Build your life on a sure foundation, Luke 6:46-49
 - 1. First step—Think a new thought, Romans 12:2

G. HOW DO I THINK A NEW THOUGHT?

- 1. Establish a daily time with Jesus, in His Word & prayer i. His Word, Job 23:12, 2nd Timothy 3:16-17, Romans 15:4
 - ii. Talk with Him in prayer, Psalm 5:3
- 2. Get a Grip on the Word of God—The Word Hand



i. Hear—Romans 10:17

ii. Read—Revelation 1:3

- a) Don't miss the opportunity to read everything God said to you at least once early in your life:
- b) Listen to the Bible on tape, CD or MP3 = 80 hours
- c) Read through once through per year:
 - Sun. & Sat.: 4 OT + 0 NT = 4 chap/day; Mon.-Fri.:
 2 OT + 1 NT = 3 chap/day
 - Reading one chapter a day takes 3-1/4 years

iii. Study—Acts 17:11

- a) If you've never done a simple survey of what the Bible says about your life in Jesus, do it with someone.
 - "Studies in Christian Living" by NavPress

iv. Memorize—Psalm 119:9-11

- a) Five verses can change your life in Jesus, equipping you for everyday life. Have breakfast once a week for five weeks with a friend and memorize the Five Assurances.
 - "Beginning with Christ" by NavPress

v. Meditate—Psalm 1:1-3
