This title was suggested to me early this year and I was captivated by the words "walking" and "victory", so I studied these words and became convinced that this was the message God had for me.

"walking" - 160 times in the Bible (many other implications)
50 times implied in Proverbs 1-10 (road, way, trail, etc.)

"victory" - not so common in the New Testament as "overcoming" but it is a common word in the Old Testament used to translate YESHUA (the Hebrew of Jesus) along with salvation, liberation.
