Applications:

- 1. Paul's 100% commitment to Jesus Christ and His gospel. Does God expect any less of us today? (Cf. v.1 "aphoridzo").
- 2. The divine-human nature of Christ as central to the gospel (even though "inscrutable").
- 3. The pivotal importance of the resurrection of Christ (cf. April 15 lesson).
- 4. "The just shall live by faith", i.e. acceptance of a person by God is based on personal faith in Christ's atonement not on his good behavior.
