- 2. The justified person has access into all of the riches of the grace of God now.

 - a. Mortality physical death
 (Immortality I Corinthians 15:51f., resurrection I Corinthians

15:23)

b. Spiritual death - second death

(Regeneration - Ephesians 2:1, no condemnation - Romans 8:1)

c. Adamic nature - personal sins

(Holy Spirit control - Romans 6-8, eventual elimination - Romans 8:23, forgiveness - Ephesians 1:7)
