Applications:

- 1. From Paul's day to the present, some will argue that a salvation not based on good conduct will necessarily produce bad conduct. Not so, per this (and many another) passage.
- 2. Our identification with Christ is not only present and future but also retroactive to the cross, i.e. in the sight of God we were actually crucified, buried and raised from death.
 Thus, no more judgment coming and no more of the "old you", experientially.
- 3. Freedom from the Law simply means a freedom to serve Christ not a freedom to sin.
