## Trusting God for His Sovereignty Jerry Bridges

## I. Introduction.

- A. Text: Matthew 10:29-31.
- B. God is absolutely sovereign over every detail of His universe and Jesus states in the passage above that that knowledge should keep us from being afraid.
  - 1. God is in control of every event in our lives.
  - 2. Often, the events of our lives are calculated to make us afraid and we are fearful because we don't see the way out.
  - 3. There is nothing that happens in your life that God does not either cause or permit to happen.
- II. There are three concepts involved in the sovereignty of God in scripture.
  - A. God has the ability to do whatever He wishes to do. (Daniel 4:35)
  - B. God can keep anything from happening that is not within His will. (James 4:13-15)
  - C. God has a right to do as He wills. He also takes responsibility for what happens in His universe. (Romans 9:20-21)
    - 1. He is in control of death and life, poverty and wealth, sickness and health, success and failures. (Exodus 4:11-12; 1 Samuel 2:6-7; Isaiah 45:7; Job 1:21)
      - a) Before Satan can touch any person, he has to get God's permission.
      - b) God does not give that permission unless it will have some benefit for you in the long run. (Lamentations 3:37-38)
        - 1) We ascribe good things to God's providence, but often we don't want to ascribe bad things to God's providence because we don't want to blame God.
        - 2) God takes responsibility for both and we lose a lot of comfort when we don't let Him take responsibility.
    - 2. We think of the events of our life as short moments, but some of the "events" of our lives last for a long time. God is in control of those, too.
- III. God is not only sovereign, but also loving and wise.
- IV. The sovereignty of God does not exclude us from having free moral wills.

- A. We can make choices- everyday choices, choices to sin, etc.
- B. God allows us to sin and He holds us responsible because we freely chose sin. However, He also controls our sin so that it accomplishes His purposes. (Genesis 50:18-20; Acts 2:22-23, 4:27-28)
