- B. We will never understand what is going on in our lives unless we understand the nature of man.
- II. What man was meant to be.
 - A. Man was made in the image and likeness of God.
 - 1. This cannot be physical in nature because God does not have a body.
 - 2. There is nothing unique in the soul of a man that would distinguish him.
 - 3. The image of God looks to the spirit of man. Fundamentally, man is a spirit expressing himself through the avenues of the soul and the body.
 - B. The faculties of spirit.
 - 1. Creativity.
 - 2. Communication.
 - 3. Morality.
 - C. Man's commands.
 - 1. He was to fill the earth and multiply.
 - 2. He was to subdue the earth.
 - D. Man retains God's image, but he has lost God's glory.
 - 1. Image and likeness is not the same thing.
 - 2. Image is the equipment and capacity to be godlike.
 - 3. Likeness is the functioning of that equipment properly or improperly.
 - E. Repudiation of self-confidence and reliance upon God is the means to manifest the likeness of God. (Colossians 3:9)
 - 1. Jesus must enter a man to restore him through every sort of circumstance.
 - 2. God is changing believers to godlikeness again.
