I. Introduction.

- A. Text: Genesis 3:6.
- B. Stages of temptation.
 - 1. Someone is lured.
 - 2. Desire is conceived giving birth to sin.
 - 3. Sin full grown brings forth death.
- II. Temptation is a desire within to move out from the limits God has established for man.
 - A. Satan created a sense of discontentment within Eve.
 - B. He then created a misleading presentation of the truth that God had declared.

C. The mind of Eve engages in the actions, but already her emotions have determined to have the forbidden fruit.

- 1. Her mind can only consider the facts as they appear to her.
- 2. She can no longer think rationally—she is rationalizing.
- 3. The mind has a terrible ability to twist the facts to meet the desire.
- D. The temptation was desirable aesthetically and for the ego.
- E. The appeal of the gospel is always to the mind.
 - 1. Any evangelism that does not start with the mind is distorted.
 - 2. It results in abortions instead of births.

F. Everything that is pleasurable is not wrong—it is only when those desires come out of order that it is wrong.

- G. The last hope was in Adam after Eve's temptation, but he fell with ease.
- III. The Fall has rendered man victim to emotional urges and twisting.
 - A. The new birth in Jesus Christ is the only solution.
 - B. We can only know what is right when judged through Jesus Christ.
