II. Sin when it is finished brings forth death.

- A. In the moment that Adam and Eve ate of the fruit, they began to die. (Romans 5)
- B. Things that mark the beginning of death.
 - 1. The people saw themselves, which brought shame and embarrassment upon them.
 - a. Man was never made to be conscious of himself.
 - b. His interests were supposed to lie outside of himself.
 - c. We try to get people to look at us as different than we are.
 - 2. Hiding, this reveals the fact of guilt.
 - 3. Passing the blame.
 - a. Many of the problems between spouses, nations, etc. come from blaming others.
 - b. Ultimately, this results in blaming God.
 - 4. Pain and death.
 - a. The whole race suffers from limitations.
 - b. Adam and Eve learned the cruel facts of a life lived apart from God.

C. The second Adam, Jesus, turns our eyes from ourselves to Him because He lives in believers and gives provision for this.

- 1. Jesus erases guilt—there is no condemnation in Him.
- 2. Jesus helps the believer to see that the problem lies with him.

3. Jesus does not take a believer out of pain, but He makes these experiences meaningful and gives joy in the midst of it.
