God's Countdown

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- I. Introduction.
 - A. Text: Daniel 9:20-27.
 - B. Daniel pinpoints the exact time in history when the Jewish Messiah would be revealed four hundred years prior to the event.
- II. Daniel realized that he was nearing the time of the end of Jeremiah's predicted time, so he prayed.
 - A. Prayer is a means by which we get involved in God's work—His program.
 - B. This is a model prayer for confession, praise and earnest petition before God.
- III. The angel gives Daniel a prophesy that has been called the backbone of prophesy.
 - A. Introduction.
 - 1. There would be a period of 490 years.
 - 2. It would concern the people of Israel.
 - 3. It would concern Jerusalem only.
 - B. The objectives to be accomplished.
 - 1. The work of redemption.
 - a. Finish transgression.
 - b. Make an end of sin.
 - c. Atone for iniquity.
 - 2. The final realization of the hopes and dreams of men.
 - a. To establish the kingdom of God.
 - b. The fulfillment of all the predictions.
 - c. The establishment of the Temple again in Jerusalem.
 - C. Threefold division of time set forth.
 - 1. Seven weeks and sixty-two weeks—the starting point of this period.
 - 2. The forty-nine year period where the city of Jerusalem would be built again.

- 3. 482 years unto the "Anointed One," that is the Messiah and a week after He would be cut off.
- 4. There is a gap between the 69th week and the 70th week when the Romans would incite terrible times and the Anti-Christ would arise making an agreement with the Jews to allow the construction of a temple before Christ returns.
- D. There is a contingency to prophesy—the fulfillment is sure but the timing is conditioned upon the people's response.
 - 1. Had the Jews received the gospel then we would be in the millennium.
 - 2. However, God is waiting upon the obedience of the Jews.
 - 3. God is waiting for us to give ourselves to the advancement of His work and not ours.
