Why are You Afraid?

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- I. Introduction. Text: Mark 4:35-5:20.
- II. The calming of the storm.
 - A. The disciples charge Jesus when the storm came because He went to sleep. We too often feel like the Lord is indifferent toward our needs.
 - B. The disciples panicked, so Jesus arose and rebuked the sea.
 - 1. The Lord was not really speaking to the elements--He spoke to the demonic elements behind the wind and the sea.
 - 2. Jesus used these same words towards a demon elsewhere.
 - C. Jesus asked the disciples why they were afraid suggesting that they had no faith.
 - 1. Faith is always the answer to our fears regardless of what they are.
 - 2. Their faith should have reminded them that the boat could not sink with the master of the universe in it and that the storm would pass.
 - 3. Failure in faith is the doorway to greater vision--even in weak faith the Lord will see us through.
- III. The casting of evil spirits into the swine.
 - A. There are various degrees in which a demon can influence a person.
 - B. Signs of the demonic.
 - 1. Physical or moral uncleanliness.
 - 2. Isolation.
 - 3. Torment.
 - 4. The immediate recognition of Jesus as the Most High God.
 - 5. Dual personality.
 - 6. Suicidal tendencies.
 - C. Jesus sent the man to the Gentiles to witness to them by simply telling them what happened to him.
- IV. Jesus is Lord whether the threat comes from without or from within.
