- I. Introduction. Text: Mark 8:38-9:29.
- II. The Lord announced the meaning of the Transfiguration before it took place--it was an announcement of His coming in glory and power.
 - A. This is a preview of what it will be like when Jesus comes again.
 - B. Peter saw this as a preview of the power of His coming. (II Peter 1:16)
- III. The Transfiguration of Jesus.
 - A. There was a glorious change in Him, which was a clear manifestation that the Lord did not need to die. (John 17)
 - B. There were heavenly visitors with Jesus: Moses and Elijah.
 - 1. Peter, James and John instantly knew who they were.
 - 2. This is a preview of something yet to come.
 - 3. This is also something that happens at the death of the believer.
 - 4. Both Moses and Elijah pointed to the Messiah.
 - 5. Not all the believers would die, and this event is previewed. (I Corinthians 15)
 - C. They spoke with Jesus concerning His departure from Jerusalem.
 - D. The disciples saw the shekinah glory of God and were greatly afraid after the event.
- IV. The post-Transfiguration conversation.
 - A. Jesus forbids the disciples of telling anyone what they had seen until the resurrection.
 - 1. They had incomplete information until they would experience that event.
 - 2. They do not know what it means what Jesus is saying about His resurrection.
 - 3. It was predicted of Jesus, not Elijah that the people would do whatever they pleased.
 - a. Elijah would indeed come, but the important thing is the cross.
 - b. John the Baptist fulfilled the coming of Elijah--he exercised his spirit and power.
- V. The impotence of the disciples to cast out a demon.

- A. The disciples were unable to cast out the demon because of their unbelief.
- B. Faith is not just believing hard enough that something will happen.
- C. The disciples' faith had been transferred from God at work to the power of the exorcism.
- D. The man's faith was challenged when Jesus said that the problem was with faith and not God's power.
- E. The man responded in humble faith: I believe, help me with my unbelief.
 - 1. All that it takes is a little faith.
 - 2. The object of the faith is what is important.
 - 3. When we have struggles with our faith, we can ask God for help.
- F. What made the difference between Jesus and the disciples was a lifestyle of prayer in the exorcism.
- G. This exorcism is tied to the transfiguration to demonstrate that the secret of the power of the kingdom now is maintaining a relationship with God.
