III. What He did.
A. Jesus drove people out with a whip.
B. Everything He did was not permanent damage, but He made His pointdo not make the Temple of God into a marketplace.
IV. What the disciples learned from watching Jesus.
A. The disciples learned that God does not compromise with evil.
1. Anyone can come to Christ no matter how evil he or she has been when he or she begins to realize that there is something wrong in his or her life.
2. If a person comes, he must know that Jesus will not leave him unchanged.
B. Bodies are the temples of God; therefore, God is to be glorified in them. (I Corinthians 6, John 4)
C. The fear of God is the beginning of wisdom.
D. Jesus sees through the facades and illusions of man.
