 - B. Jesus claims either lead us to conclude He is Lord, a liar or a lunatic.
 - C. Eternal life is a spiritual life that emphasizes the quality.
 - 1. It is rich.
 - 2. It must be given by Jesus alone.
 - 3. Without it, one is headed to hell.
 - 4. The relationship one has with Jesus Christ is the most important one—it determines one's final destiny.

 - A. One must commit himself to following Jesus obediently.
 - B. This one immediately receives eternal life.
