- A. Text: John 11:1-16.
- B. The hardest problem to handle for some is what to do when God does something that we do not expect.
- II. The death and resurrection of Lazarus.
 - A. The home of Lazarus was a love filled home. A love filled home is God's masterpiece.
 - B. The death of Lazarus was intended for the glory of God.
 - 1. Jesus knew that Lazarus was dead but He intended to stay despite this.
 - 2. He stayed because He loved Mary and Martha.
 - 3. God's delays are not God's denials.
 - 4. Delays are signs of God's love because He stretches our faith.
- III. What the episode reveals about how Jesus thinks.
 - A. He does not act because of fear.
 - B. He acts because of timing—He is orchestrating the whole procedure.
 - C. God has appointed a time for each of us, and if we are walking in the light there is nothing that can shorten or lengthen it.
- IV. Death for Jesus is just an introduction to a greater experience for our loved ones—it is not a final farewell.
 - A. It is difficult to wait, but this is not the end of the story.
 - B. God's thoughts are not our thoughts, and His ways are not our ways.
 - C. We must never question God's ways or lose faith in His Word.
