- I. Introduction. Text: John 12:12-26.
- II. The triumphal entry. It was not actually a welcome by the city.
- B. Pilgrims, not residents of the city, came to greet Jesus.
  - C. Nobody understood the nature of this event at first.
  - D. It was not even a spontaneous organization—it was a carefully planned demonstration organized by Jesus Himself in accordance with the Scripture. (Daniel 9)
  - E. It was not triumphal—Jesus wept over the city because the people did not recognize the time of the Messiah's coming. (Luke 19:41)
  - F. The Lord came riding a symbol of peace.
  - G. When the Gentiles came, Jesus recognized that the hour had come for Him to be glorified.
- III. We would have known nothing of Jesus had He not gone to the cross.
  - A. The only true way to glory is to die.
  - B. Jesus' servants must follow Him in His steps.
  - C. The true gospel demands that the believer die.
  - D. There is a self-centered life that has to die so that a loving, gracious and peaceful life can take its place.
  - E. Bearing one's cross means...
    - 1. A once for all decision that recognizes one's life is not his own.
    - 2. A daily following up on this decision doing what is right and ceasing from wrong.
    - 3. If one belongs to Jesus, every day will have its cross. If we choose to die, we will live.
