I. Introduction.

- A. Text: John 15:12-16:4.
- B. The business of the Christian life is discovering what the statement "You in Me, and I in you" means.
- C. Three things that result from this principle.
 - 1. We begin to become more Christ-like.
 - 2. Our relationships with each other change.
 - 3. Our relationships with outsiders are improved.
- II. We are commanded to love one another.
 - A. Real love is a decision to act for someone else no matter how one feels.
 - B. A motive is suggested when Jesus asks them to love as He has loved them.
 - 1. The disciples were to draw on Jesus' love.
 - 2. When we do not feel like loving others, we must begin to review Christ's love for us. (Romans 8)
 - C. What real love looks like.
 - 1. Laying one's life down.
 - a. This is a process—there are levels of laying one's life down.
 - b. Basically, it means to give of oneself.
 - 2. Being a friend.
 - a. This means to share life with someone.
 - b. Love is an open sharing of who you are—taking down the facades.
 - D. Jesus strategically put us wherever we are at to bear fruit in difficult challenges and pray for one another.
- III. The Lord helps us to understand the world's hostility.
 - A. There is nothing personal about it—Jesus experienced this too. (Hebrews 12)

- C. Persecution cannot be avoided but the Christian will still find success.
 - 1. Men do not respond because of godlessness—people are worshipping the wrong god. The basic problem is ignorance.
 - 2. Yet they also have no excuse because Jesus revealed the Father through His words and works.
- D. How to respond to the world's hatred.
 - 1. The Spirit will bear witness in us.
 - 2. We must witness to what we have experienced.
 - 3. We must hold strong despite persecution.
 - 4. We have been forewarned and know that it is going to come.
