- I. Introduction.
 - A. Text: John 20:19-31.
 - B. The first reaction to Jesus' resurrection was fear by the disciples.
 - C. The disciples began meeting on the first day of the week for the Sabbath because of Jesus' resurrection.
- II. Jesus materialized through the doors to meet with the disciples emphasizing that Jesus is always with us.
- III. Jesus greets the disciples with peace. Peace is the right of every believer.
- IV. Jesus showed the disciples His hands and sides and ate to demonstrate that He was no ghost—He bodily rose from the dead.
- V. Jesus came to the disciples at this point to give them the Holy Spirit.
 - A. The Baptism of the Spirit has to do with identifying with Christ. (Romans 6, I Corinthians 6)
 - B. The filling of the Spirit is equipping for ministry.
 - C. This event in John pictures the indwelling of the Spirit—Jesus' dwelling within the disciples.
 - D. The indwelling of the Spirit is the sealing of the Spirit that marks the beginning of ministry.
 - E. The ministry is drawing life from the Son of God. Jesus was the model for this ministry drawing upon God.
 - F. The believer's task with the gospel is to deal with the problem of guilt among men.
 - 1. The good news is that we can claim a sense of forgiveness of sins.
 - 2. The believer can offer this to others as well.
- VI. Doubting Thomas voices the doubt that we all have sometimes about the resurrection.
 - A. After experiencing the evidences of the resurrection, Thomas believes Jesus is God and worships Him.
 - B. Jesus testifies to the efficacy of the written witness about Jesus' resurrection and the blessing that comes from believing it.
