I. Introduction.

A. Text: Acts 4:13-31.

B. Peter boldly charged the Jewish people with the death of Jesus declaring that there is salvation in no one else.

II. The high priests are a remarkable picture of human deception.

A. They think they are acting in reason, but they are acting contrary to it.

B. It became clear that anyone who had anything to do with Jesus began to act differently.

C. The priests admitted that the act of healing was a sign.

D. The inconsistency of the Jewish rulers led to an act of illegitimacy.

III. There are times when it is right to disobey properly constituted authorities.

A. This civil disobedience is only valid if it contravenes a more important aspect of the Word of God.

B. Governments are given by God. (Romans 13)

C. The human conscience alone is not enough for civil disobedience therefore; a direct word from God is needed.

D. Conscience is given to prompt a man to choose right not to know right--conscience is not to be followed unless it is based upon the Word of God clearly.
