 - G. There is a wonderful blending between the sovereignty of God and the choice of men.
 - 1. We must sometimes start with what we are most confident that God would want.
 - 2. Paul and Barnabus started in the synagogue because the gospel was to start with the Jews and then go to the Greeks. This is the sovereign choice of the Spirit. (Romans 1)
 - 3. Mark accompanied them showing human choice.
 - 4. Man is not an automaton.
 - a. God is not interested in running us like robots, but guiding us at the appropriate times.
 - b. This makes life exciting because God is creative.
 - c. One cannot improve on the strategy of the Holy Spirit.
 - H. The encounter with Bar-Jesus.
 - 1. He was a Christian cultist who seized upon Jesus' name in order to teach unchristian things.
