- D. The hidden resource of Jesus' sinless life was communion and fellowship with an indwelling Father.

- B. Kinds of suffering.
 - 1. Those that result from one's own folly.
 - 2. Those that result from circumstances beyond our control.
 - 3. Those that result from involving ourselves with the needs of others.
- C. What can be done about suffering.
 - 1. Break out, which refers to rebellion.
 - 2. Break down, which refers to self-pity.
 - 3. Break through, which is accepting suffering by the grace of God.
- D. Suffering is the process by which God brings glory to the believer's life.
- E. Suffering results in releasing creation from its futility.
