- I. Introduction.
 - A. Text: Romans 4:1-12.
 - B. Righteousness is the gift of worth from God that He gives men.
- II. Three important questions about Abraham.
 - A. How Abraham was given the gift of worth.
 - 1. We can gain worth by performance.
 - a. We all find clever ways of showing our importance.
 - b. What we desperately need is a sense of worth.
 - c. Performance does not work for God because He knows the heart.
 - 2. Abraham found approval by faith instead.
 - a. Abraham became the friend of God.
 - b. He achieved it by believing what God said about the coming of Jesus, His death and His resurrection (Galatians says that God taught Abraham what was meant by his seed).
 - 3. What one earns is given as a wage (what is due), but what one is given is received as a gift—Abraham received his worth as a gift.
 - 4. David received his worth as a gift. (Psalm 51)
 - 5. The believer's standing rests on the work of Christ.
 - B. When Abraham was given the gift of worth.
 - 1. He was given this gift before circumcision.
 - 2. Therefore, Abraham could not have been accepted based on a ritual.
 - 3. The real purpose of circumcision was as a sign and a seal.
 - C. Why Abraham was given the gift of worth.
 - 1. It was to make him a father of the Jews and the Gentiles.
 - 2. All believers are children of Abraham by faith.

III. Faith is the only way to gain worth from God.
