- A. Text: I Corinthians 15:25-49.
- B. The Corinthians were skeptical about the resurrection of the body, so they raised several questions about it.
- II. How the dead are raised.
 - A. Plants growing from seeds placed in the ground picture resurrection.
 - B. Death is essential step for resurrection—it is not an obstacle to it.
- III. What kind of body the dead received.
 - A. There are bodies of different kinds.
 - B. These differences are the result of different personalities that beings have—there is a correspondence to what the body looks like and what the being inside is like.
 - C. There is a marked difference between heavenly bodies and earthly bodies.
 - 1. Heavenly bodies shine.
 - 2. The glory of the earthly body is in its distinct function.
 - D. There is a difference in the glory of celestial bodies as it is with the resurrection of the dead.
 - 1. The body decays but the resurrection body does not.
 - 2. From within, Jesus is imparting life right now to the soul and is waiting to restore the body as well.
 - E. The hope the believer has is that when Jesus appears the believer will be like Him. (I John 3)
