 - A. Text: II Corinthians 4:1-6.
 - B. Many Christians are ready to quit
 - 1. They do not see themselves as the instruments of God at work.
 - 2. They focus on what they are doing for God.
 - 3. They do not understand the New Covenant for living that God has provided in Christ.
- II. Reasons that the New Covenant does not allow for discouragement in ministry.
 - A. Disgraceful underhanded ways are refused.
 - 1. Paul turned his back on ways that bring discouragement.
 - 2. This includes deceitful practices.
 - 3. There are those who tamper with God's Word.
 - a. Resurrection is spiritualized.
 - b. "Christ" is made to mean something else.
 - c. People claim that the Bible has been proven wrong.
 - 4. Truth is not determined by whether it feels good but by whether it explains reality.
 - 5. Truth speaks to the conscience and not only the mind.
 - 6. People are perishing because they do not believe—they do not believe because they are blinded by the devil.
 - a. The veil man has is that he is able to handle life by himself.
 - b. Men everywhere want to be like God.
 - c. It is wrong to believe that we can be like God by ourselves.
 - d. Only Christ can take away the veil of deceit.
 - B. Ministry is for service and not mastery or submission.
 - 1. Christ is the master and Lord.

2.	Christ	as	Lord	is	preached	not	oneself.

- a. The need of human hearts everywhere is to see that Jesus is Lord. (Romans 10)
- b. Turning to the Lord removes the veil.
- c. One finds the glory of God in Jesus and Jesus in the Scriptures.
