I. Introduction.

- A. Text: II Corinthians 6:3-1-0.
- B. Problem: do you have to be a fanatic to be a Christian?

II. The ministry of reconciliation will be demonstrated in great zeal if lived out to the fullest.

- A. Our ministry is to be like Paul's.
- B. The ministry of reconciliation will require certain carefulness before men.

1. We need to have an awareness of what we look like to others to be careful not to turn others off from being a Christian.

2. Paul was accused of many things but none of these stuck because his conscience cleared him—they were false accusations.

3. Someone is always watching us to see how we behave and see what we allow.

C. God approves this ministry.

  - b. Tough opposition: beatings, imprisonments, tumults.

1) What enabled Paul to be pure was that he constantly renewed his mind by the Holy Spirit. (Romans 12)
