- B. The apostle is stressing the need to live as a Christian wherever you are.
- C. You can state the secret of Christian living in one sentence: walk in the Spirit and you will not fulfill the lusts of the flesh.
- II. Wives are to submit to their husbands.
 - A. Feminists have bristled at this.
 - B. However, submission does not deny equality—everyone is to submit himself or herself to someone.
 - C. The Lord's own submitting Himself to the Father is the ultimate pattern—this Jesus delighted in.
 - D. Submission means to voluntarily place oneself under another for a purpose of some sort. It stresses the need for support.
- III. The husband is to love his wife.
 - A. This does not mean make love, but honor and respect.
 - B. He is to plan in order to love her well.
 - C. He is to put off harshness.
- IV. Children are to obey their parents in everything.
 - A. This means to hear under someone recognizing that one is over you.
 - B. God can be pleased through obedience to parents.
 - 1. It preserves peace in the home.
 - 2. It teaches obedience to authority.
 - C. This ought to be taught to children as they are growing up.
- V. Fathers are not to irritate their children.
 - A. Frequent nagging results in encouragement.
