I. Introduction.

- A. Text: Ephesians 1:1-3.
- B. The letter deals with the whole sweep of truth of God.
- C. Ephesians has great and practical truth.

II. Background.

- A. It was written to the Christians to the Roman province of Asia.
- B. Many early manuscripts do not have "to the Ephesians," so it is thought to be a circular letter.
- C. Paul's credentials.
 - 1. He is an Apostle—one sent by Jesus Christ.
 - 2. Paul learned from Jesus directly.
- D. The Christians were described as saints in the will of Christ Jesus.
 - 1. The mark of the saint is not that he does not have problems.
 - 2. The mark of the saint is that he faces problems and life differently.
 - 3. The other characteristic of a saint is that he is faithful.
- E. The two great inheritances of the Christian are grace and peace.
- F. Paul usually begins with an area of doctrine and summarizes with a great statement.
- III. Summary: blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places.
 - A. The starting point is God.
 - 1. When a man begins with God, you know that what he is going to say is in line with reality.
 - 2. Natural thinking is faulty—we need to learn to be spiritual thinkers about ourselves.
 - B. The aim—to bring about a world filled with blessing.
 - 1. This is for the praise of God.

2. This is not about God's ego though—God wants to produce a sense of awe and amazement in us that stops to give thanks to a glorious God.

C. The blessings.

- 1. We were chosen in Him before the foundation of the world that we should be holy and blameless before Him.
- 2. He destined us in love to be His Sons in Jesus Christ according to the purpose of His will to the praise of His glorious grace.
- 3. In Him, we have redemption through His blood—the forgiveness of trespasses—according to the riches of His grace.
- 4. He has made known to us the mystery of His will—He has unfolded for us what He plans to do.
- 5. In Him, we who first hoped in Christ have been destined and appointed to live—God has appointed us to be a demonstration.
- 6. In Him, we have heard the word of truth.
- 7. We are sealed with the promised Holy Spirit.
- D. The blessings are a list of the incompetency of man—they are the gifts of God.
- E. All the blessings are in Christ.
 - 1. Everything is emphasized as coming through Christ.
 - 2. The only blessing that can ever come to you from God must always come through Christ.
- F. This all takes place in the heavenly places.
 - 1. These are the unseen invisible realities. (II Corinthians 4)
 - 2. We live in a life were most realities are invisible, but they must be recognized.
- G. Progress comes from recognizing what God has already done.
 - 1. The only thing that will last is the work of God.
 - 2. God is restoring people by destroying the hate and bringing people together.
 - 3. God's great movement is to heal and make whole.
 - 4. God's great work has begun in us—the more it is visibly evident the more the world will experience it.
