- II. The answer to spiritual powers.
 - A. Put on the whole armor of God.
 - 1. This is realizing what we are to Christ and what Christ is to us.
 - 2. It is reckoning oneself dead to sin and alive to God.
 - B. Pray. One must talk to God about the problems and lean on His help.
- III. The key is to stand.
 - A. This means to refuse to give up ground.
 - B. Stand reveals the intensity of the struggle in which we are involved.
 - C. The problems of the world are only getting worse despite how things appear.
 - D. God permits hardship in order that the false believers will be exposed.
 - E. Stand indicates that the believer is on the defense--the proper defense will win the day.
 - 1. The enemy is trying to deceive us as to what we have.
 - 2. All of what we need has been given to us by God, and we must hold onto this. (Jude 1)
 - 3. Defense is the greatest offensive action.
 - 4. It is Christians who learn to stand who bring enjoyment to life.
 - 5. It is the fact that the Christian can stand that draws others to him.

 - G. Loneliness and loss are disciplines to temper the spiritual life.
