  - B. This power is for every deed so that God is given glory in everything.

    - 1. Paul has been redeemed and made righteous. (Galatians 2:20, II Corinthians 5:7)
    - 2. This is more than a humble expression—Paul is thinking of himself as a total man living in a world of evil with active flesh despite redemption.
