 - A. Text: II Timothy 4:1-4.
 - B. Paul is seeking to open Timothy's eyes to the importance of what he is trying to do.
- II. It is helpful to realize that what we are doing is important.
 - A. Paul reminds Timothy that he is laboring in the presence of God the Father.
 - B. Jesus understands all of human history and before Him Timothy has his ministry.
 - C. Believers are the spectacle of the universe. (I Corinthians 4)
 - D. Paul advises Timothy to look to Christ's first appearing to know that he is involved in the advance of this great work of God.
 - 1. The ministry of Christians is extremely important.
