- I. Introduction.
 - A. Text: Hebrews 7:27-8:13.
 - B. Jesus Christ can only be understood in light of the cross.
- II. Understanding the cross opens up a new dimension of ministry.
 - A. Christ became both priest and sacrifice because there was no one else worthy.
 - B. The cross is timeless and contemporary.
 - 1. It is the central act of history.
 - 2. This is a new dimension that is always meaningful.
 - C. The results of the perfect sacrifice are being continually ministered to the believer in the proper sanctuary.
 - 1. We can enjoy the realm of matter but we cannot enjoy the realm of the Spirit—only Jesus, man's high priest, can enter into this "Holy of Holies."
 - 2. Only through Jesus can man enter into the realm where the secrets of life are held.
 - 3. Man penetrates into this secret area of his own being through the cross.
 - 4. The cross affects a person physically, emotionally and spiritually.
 - D. God makes a New Covenant with us by writing the law on human hearts.
 - 1. Man was never intended to keep the law by himself.
 - 2. The fundamental problem is a problem of motivation—God gives us a new power to do what needs to be done.
 - 3. In the New Covenant, the believer belongs to God forever and knows Him.
