- I. Introduction.
  - A. Text: John 17:1-2.
  - B. Jesus prayed this prayer aloud because the basic statements Jesus prayed to the Father, the believer can pray also.
- II. The disciples sensed that something was wrong as they heard Jesus pray in the Garden fearing that He was going to leave them.
- III. Jesus is looking forward to a time of boundless opportunity with the phrase "the Hour has come."
  - A. Jesus constantly told others that His hour had not come.
  - B. As He comes to the cross He states that the Hour has come.
  - C. This was an anticipation based upon the principle that death brings forth much fruit.
    - 1. Beyond the cross lays the glory of God.
    - 2. The cross, however, is the only way to it.
    - 3. This principle applies to the believer as well.
- IV. Jesus speaks out of the security of an adequate relationship.
  - A. The Father continually gives to the Son power over all flesh.
  - B. The purpose of the power is to give eternal life to whoever might come to Jesus.
  - C. Jesus will meet those however they come--they only need to come.
  - D. God is ready to give the believer power over all flesh in whatever needs we face.
  - E. We must have what God is in order to do what He did.
- V. The unveiling of abounding possibility: eternal life.
  - A. Eternal life is knowing Jesus and the Father.
  - B. Eternal life is a relationship--it is in knowing another person that richness is added to life.
  - C. The results of a personal knowledge of God.
