I. Introduction.

- A. Text: Ephesians 6:14-17.
- B. The armor of God defends us in attack and makes it possible that we might stand in an evil day.
- C. Only the Christian is able to resist the attack of the devil by putting on this armor.
- D. The armor is representative of Christ.
 - 1. The first three pieces have to do with you in Christ.
 - 2. The last three pieces have to do with Christ in you.
- E. The Word of God has been given to us so that we can manage practicing Christian truth. (Colossians)
- F. The authority of Scripture is the authority of Jesus Christ.
- II. The sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God.
 - A. The sword of the Spirit is a saying of God applied to a specific situation.
 - B. This saying is used for defense against the deceit of the devil.
 - C. The sword is the only weapon that is both defensive and offensive. (Hebrews 4:12)
 - D. The devil goes out of his way to make the Bible appear fantastical in order to prevent people from reading it.
 - E. The answer to the devil's deceit is to read the honest accounts of Scripture. (Proverbs 3:4-5, Ephesians 4)
 - F. The greater exposure there is to Scripture, the more the Word can have an effect.
 - G. The responsibility of the Christian when a saying is placed in his mind is to heed it and take it seriously.
 - H. We are to compare Scripture with Scripture to discern its meaning.
 - I. Jesus answered the devil by quoting Scripture.
- III. To become a Christian is to put on the armor of God.
 - A. We are to use this armor so that we do not fail.
