- A. Text: Matthew 24:36-51.
- B. The solution to the problems of our society will be in the return of Jesus.
- II. Jesus is referring this arrival to gather the church not His final coming.
 - A. His coming to gather the church will be completely unpredictable—it is folly to predict dates for the coming of Christ. No one will miss His final coming to judge.
 - B. His coming will be unexpected.
 - C. His coming is unavoidable.
 - 1. We desperately need the Word of God and the Spirit of God so that we might watch appropriately for the signs of the time.
 - 2. Watching is having an obedient ear.
 - 3. We are to keep busy in the strength and purpose to which God has called us.
 - 4. We are to keep doing this until God comes or until we die.
 - D. His coming is unalterable.
 - 1. At the return of Christ, what we have really been will be unalterable.
 - 2. The one who stands to the end will be set over all of Christ's possessions.
 - 3. The return of Christ simply reveals what a man is.
 - 4. Time is a precious commodity—we are to redeem it.
 - 5. Whatever works do not come from God will be destroyed.
