I. Introduction.

- A. Text: Matthew 22:1-14.
- B. On the surface, the parable of the wedding feast is an invitation that we must accept, but there is a deeper meeting.
- II. Elements of the parable of the wedding feast.
 - A. Occasion: wedding feast.
 - 1. These are joyful occasions.
 - 2. This is the way that Jesus characterizes the invitation to the gospel (many receive it as if it was an invitation to a funeral).
 - 3. The kingdom of God is life and vitality. (Romans 14:17)
 - 4. God is inviting us to discover life.
 - B. The call: it is an invitation.
 - 1. This recognizes the right of the one invited to reject the invitation.
 - 2. Jesus did not grow angry at the rejection, but He sent other servants to plead.
 - 3. Men were putting the ordinary matters of life before this invitation to discover the secret to life.
 - 4. When men refuse this life, they deny essential elements of humanity.
 - C. The wedding crasher.
 - 1. This is the picture of hidden rebellion.
 - 2. There is an outward pretense of following the Lord, but this was not outward.
 - 3. God looks to the heart to see whether a person has genuinely entered into new life.
