I. Introduction.

- A. Text: II Corinthians 4:12-5:4.
- B. The key in the passage is that it is all for your sake.
- II. Death was at work in the Apostle so that life would be work in others.
 - A. The basis for prayer in the Scriptures is holding up others.
 - B. The Psalmist cried out to God and believed despite his circumstances. (Psalm 116)
 - C. Paul introduces the thought of what is to come in the Christian life as a transition. (Romans 8)

III. We do not lose heart.

- A. Although our outer nature is wasting, our inner nature is being renewed.
 - 1. Our inheritance is love, joy and peace.
 - 2. We should manifest this all the time.
 - 3. Unlike with the nonbeliever, the best is yet to be. Our lessons now will have value later.
- B. The momentary affliction is producing for us an eternal glory.
 - 1. Jesus goes away to prepare a place for us.
 - 2. The way that Jesus prepares a place for us is by sending the Holy Spirit.
 - 3. The "light momentary afflictions" are great trials in actuality that prepare the eternal weight of glory.
 - 4. Eternity is a rich and weighty thing that increases in splendor.
- C. We look towards unseen things that are not transient.
 - 1. The world consists of hidden realities. (Hebrews 11)
 - 2. The things that are seen are only a temporary manifestation of visible forces.
 - 3. We will see visibly what is invisible now. (Romans 8)
 - 4. A new body will be revealed to us—we will not permanently be without a body. (I Corinthians 15)

- 5. The problem of the time between the resurrection is answered by...
 - a. Soul sleep. This is a good answer but does not deal with the immediate feeling of the resurrected body in the passage.
 - b. An intermediate body until the resurrection. This is a creation out of silence.
 - c. A distinguishing between time and eternity.
 - 1. We will not be bound by time in eternity.
 - 2. This means that at the Rapture everyone will encounter each other right after his or her death.
 - 3. Apart from us, the Old Testament saints are not made perfect. The cross is a timeless event. We were chosen before the foundation of the world. Therefore, time is not an ultimate condition. (Revelation 12, Jude)
