- I. Introduction.
  - A. Text: II Corinthians 5:13-6:2.
  - B. One of the most visible marks of someone who has come to live in the New Covenant is a refusal to guit based upon fear and love.
- II. Elements of the ministry of reconciliation.
  - A. It is equipping.
    - 1. The basic pattern is the same—equipping and loving the saints.
    - 2. You can meet together to plan, not in order to devise strategy, but to apply it.
  - B. It is something that is personal to us.
    - 1. We are all called to share what we have personally experienced.
    - 2. Some may be given the gift of evangelism, but all are to share.
  - C. It is universally inclusive.
    - 1. Culture sometimes needs to be adapted.
    - 2. Culture sometimes needs to be changed.
  - D. It is not counting their trespasses against them—this is the message and it is without condemnation.
  - E. It is delivered by men.
  - F. It is owned and accrediting by God.
  - G. It beseeches and not commands—it is voluntarily accepted. (Romans 12:1-2)
  - H. It achieves what is otherwise impossible—that we might become the righteousness or worth of God.
  - I. It is achieved moment by moment. One must take one moment at a time.
